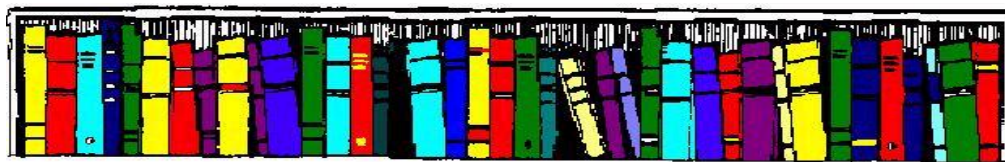


Thomas Marshall “Jack” Robbins

Inspired by a matchless passion to extend the realm of commitment to community, the Education Foundation offers this scholarship to honor Jack Robbins as philanthropist.

Born November 13, 1919 in Caldwell County, Thomas Marshall “Jack” Robbins attended Valmead Elementary School and graduated in 1937 from Central Lenoir High School. Mr. Robbins attended North Carolina State University and returned to Lenoir to begin a life of great achievement and philanthropy among work and community.

Mr. Robbins served in the United States Navy during World War II. After his service in the Navy, Mr. Robbins returned to his wife, Ruth Kincaid Robbins, secretary/treasurer of Kincaid Furniture. Mr. Robbins, along with Wade and George Kincaid, began Kincaid Trucking. The Kincaid transportation division began with one truck in 1953 which grew under Mr. Robbins’ business leadership into a nationwide transportation fleet. After retiring in 1998, Mr. Robbins served on the LA-Z-Boy Board of Directors and devoted his time to personal finance with great success.

Jack Robbins was a 50 year member of the First Presbyterian Church of Lenoir where he also served as deacon. In 1954, he became a volunteer fireman and after years of dedicated service was named Honorary Captain, Lenoir Volunteer Fire Department.

Mr. Robbins’ changed the quality of life of many lives in Caldwell County and beyond when he left from his estate \$15,400,000.00 to seven charities: The Education Foundation Inc. of Caldwell County, CCC&TI, First Baptist Church of Hudson, First Presbyterian Church of Lenoir, Caldwell County Hospice and Palliative Care, Caldwell Memorial Hospital Foundation, and the Mayo Clinic. Rochester, MN.

Mr. Robbins was a man of compassion who never wanted recognition for his acts of kindness. His joy was to quietly help others.

Who is Eligible?

The Thomas Marshall “Jack” Robbins Scholarship is open to applicants of all races. Applicants must be US citizens, have a high school GPA of 3.2 or higher, and must be interested in seeking a degree of higher learning. All applicants must meet requirements for admissions to an institute of higher learning of their choice. Consideration is given to those students who have shown academic promise and leadership qualities. Final decisions are based on the OVERALL student, not financial need, high grade point averages or high SAT scores.
